





# **Economic incentives**

- About two-thirds of deforestation is carried out by large landowners.
- Brazilian tax code provides hefty effective subsidies to expansion of agriculture in the Amazon.
- This, along with industrial-scale agriculture, has allowed Brazil producers to easily compete with US exports.








- -Average yield for Amazonian soybean plantations: 2000 kg/ha
- -Maximum length of cultivation without fertilizer: 3-6 years.

The US also subsidizes Amazonian soy plantations.

- Brazilian government policy is ambiguous at best; capacity to enforce the law is lacking.
- Agribusiness interests have considerable political clout.
- The most effective way to discourage deforestation may be to pressure major buyers into boycotting deforesters.






RIO DE JANEIRO — Greenpeace on Thursday said McDonald's was fueling Amazon rainforest destruction by using soybeans grown in the region as feed for chickens that end up served in the fast-food chain's European restaurants.

In a reported entitled, "Eating up the Amazon," the environmental group said it has traced soy beans grown in illegally desforested areas of the rainforest to McDonald's restaurants, as well as other restaurant chains and supermarkets across Europe.

"Fast Food giants like McDonald's are trashing the Amazon for cheap meat. Every time you buy a Chicken McNugget you could be taking a hite out of the Amazon." Greenneace forests campaign coordinator Gavin





# Deforestation in Indonesia


- Unlike in Brazil, deforestation is driven by the demands of the pulp and plywood industries.
- Between 1985 and 1997, 16 million ha were deforested, of which only 6 million ha have been converted to other land uses.
- However, palm oil plantations are increasing in profitability.








# How long would reforestation efforts have to be in effect before they create a noticeable change in the environment?



Coverage of old-growth forest in the United States, 17th century to present day.



Current forest coverage in North America. Regrowth of forests in temperate regions sequesters 200 Mt of carbon per year.

Does planting plantations of trees sequester a significant amount of carbon? Do you have to cut them down, bury them, and plant more to have a significant impact?

- •It depends on what happens in the landfill.
- •Decomposing wood in a landfill gives an approximate methane yield of 0.02 grams per gram of dry refuse.
- •This means that less than 5% of the carbon contained in the wood is returned to the atmosphere.
